The European Observatory Venice Summer School 2020 is focused on the issue of the Hospital of the future, in times of Covid-19, intended as an ideal place where efficiency, sustainability and full respect for the patient can be offered at the same time. The Course is intended to develop concrete proposals, starting from the study and analysis of the current situation of the hospital systems of the partner countries to define an advanced and deeply innovative model of hospital capable of responding to the changing needs of individual citizens and to the new demands of the society, designed on the basis of the indications emerging in the literature and the best operational experiences achieved at an international level.

The 2020 Summer School program also includes a special session on Covid-19 with a specific study on the winning strategy adopted by Veneto Region against the coronavirus: test, trace and treat.

**The Veneto Health System Response to COVID-19:
Planning services, Strategic Innovations and Lessons**

The session will provide an overview of what has proven to be a successful response to the COVID-19 pandemic in the Veneto region. It will highlight the main strategies, showing their impact and draw main lessons. The opening presentations will focus on three key strategic areas. First, it will outline the main elements of the governance model adopted to manage the COVID-19 emergency including the role of the Community. Second, it will show the strategies to prevent transmission including the epidemiological surveillance and the approach to ‘find, test, trace and isolate’ cases. Finally, the emphasis of the session will be on the strategies and innovations in the delivery of services and human resources including ‘COVID-19 dedicated hospitals’; doubling the number of beds for intensive care, infectious diseases and pneumology;

increasing health staff; triaging practices in A&E services or the establishment of semi-intensive care units.
